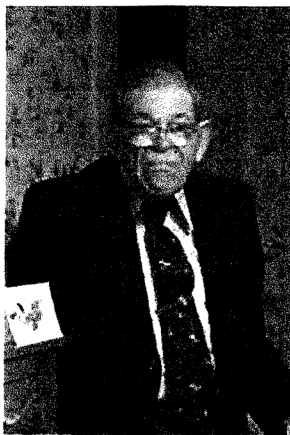

NEWELL GREEN

1901-1993 – Ascutney, Vermont



Newell was elected posthumously a member of the Pioneer Valley Photographic Artists (PVPA) in recognition of his significant contributions to photography in our area. Born in Hartford, Ct in 1901, he died at his home in Ascutney, VT in 1993 at the age of 92.

Newell was an acknowledged master of the fine art of pictorial photography and was recognized internationally for the quality and sensitivity of his rural Vermont photographs. He was honored many times and in many ways throughout his life which included the honors of being elected an honorable member of the Photographic Society of America (Hon. PSA), a fellowship in the Photographic Society of America (FPSA), a fellowship in the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain (FRPS), and as an honorary member of the New England Camera Club Council (Hon. NEC).

Afflicted from birth with the spastic form of Cerebral Palsy, Newell took up photography in the late 20s. For nearly 50 years he pursued with great passion his desire to capture with his camera the essence of the rural Vermont he knew and loved. As a result he has left with us a wonderful body of his original prints that clearly portray his deep sensitivity for the people and countryside of his beloved homeland.
